



Medical treatment – Cameroon

	Required documents for residents in Cameroon travelling to Sweden	Check
	Application for Schengen Visa –application form completed and signed.	
	Passport: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Original passport valid for travel to Sweden. The passport validity must exceed the planned stay in the Schengen Area with at least three months. The passport must have been issued within the last ten years.• Complete photocopies of original passport, except blank pages.• Previous passport in original if a new passport has been issued within the last year.	
	Proof of visa fee payment (bank deposit slip) or proof of fee exemption (if applicable).	
	Individual medical travel insurance valid in all Schengen countries for the duration of the stay, covering the costs of at least EUR 30,000 which could arise as a result of emergency medical assistance, emergency hospitalization or medical repatriation.	
	1 color photo not more than 6 months old, passport size (45 mm x 35 mm), full face and taken against a light background.	
	Applicants who submitted fingerprints in a previous application and <u>were granted a Schengen visa within the last 59 months</u> are <u>exempted</u> from resubmitting a new fingerprint.	
	Copy of national identity card.	
	For non-Cameroon nationals: Cameroonian residence permit or proof of legal stay in any other country within the Embassy’s coverage area, valid at least three months beyond the planned stay in the territory of the Member States.	
	Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.	
	If married, a marriage certificate should be submitted.	
	Birth certificate for minor children. If the certificate has been issued based on a court order, the order/decision should also be submitted.	
	If employed: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Employment certificate- the 3 latest salary slips,- CNPS registration (from the social security authority)- employer’s operation permit as well as the commercial registration number are required If self-employed: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Operation permit for present year and the previous year- Commercial registration number- tax registration number- tax bill- import license- the company’s bank certificate for the last 3 months	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - other documents showing the nature and the extent of the operation. <p>If you have a non-income employment or work:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Documents showing enough funds for living expenses should be submitted. Documents proving income from spouse or parents and a guarantee, may also be submitted, if applicable. 	
	<p>Proof of sufficient funds for the whole stay in the Schengen area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bank certificate for the last 3 months and if applicable a credit card extract showing recent transactions as well as other documents that can give information about your solvency (such as document of acquisition, paycheck, currency and the receipt of exchange). 	
	<p>A letter from the medical institution or doctor in the Member State of destination indicating the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the contact with the local doctor - nature of the treatment - estimated time for recovery - the need for return visits - the cost of treatment - the mention that the patient is accepted - the indication that the treatment can be performed the indication that the medical institution or doctor agrees with the intended method of payment 	
	<p>Certificate issued by the applicant's local doctor in Cameroon providing background information about the medical treatment and confirming the need of specific medical treatment to be provided abroad.</p>	
	<p>Proof of pre-payment of the treatment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment (and related expenses).</p>	
	<p>A declaration of financial responsibility regarding the planned medical treatment or a confirmation of payment issued by the hospital/clinic, of the amount requested for the actual treatment.</p>	
	<p>Proof of accommodation, if applicable.</p>	
	<p>Please note that the Embassy will consider your socioeconomic situation in your home country or in your country of residence if not the same. It is your responsibility to submit any other documents related to personal ties in Cameroon, such as marriage certificate, title deeds or lease agreements.</p>	

Please note:

- Applications can be submitted up to 6 months before the intended travel and **not less** than 15 calendar days before the intended travel. Please note that the days are counted from when the Embassy has received the application and **not** when the application was submitted at VFS Global. The transportation time between the application centers and Nairobi is published on the website of VFS Global.
- The handling time may take up to 15 days (counted from when the Embassy has received a complete application) but may take up to 45 days, if verification of documents or an interview needs to be conducted or such.
- All submitted documents must be in English or in Swedish.
- An interview may be required at the Embassy or by phone.
- Further information or documentary evidence in support of your application may be required.
- All documents are mandatory. If documents are not submitted at the time of application, they may be sent within **2 working days** to the following email address: ambassaden.nairobi-visum@gov.se. If mandatory

documents, as stated in the checklists, are not received within the stipulated time, the Embassy will make a decision based on existing documentation.
