



Medical treatment – Ethiopia

	Required documents for residents in Ethiopia travelling to Sweden/Norway	Check
	Application for Schengen Visa –application form completed and signed.	
	Passport: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Original passport valid for travel to Sweden. The passport validity must exceed the planned stay in the Schengen Area with at least three months. The passport must have been issued within the last ten years.• Complete photocopies of original passport, except blank pages.• Previous passport in original if a new passport has been issued within the last year.	
	Proof of visa fee payment (bank deposit slip) or proof of fee exemption (if applicable).	
	Individual medical travel insurance valid in all Schengen countries for the duration of the stay, covering the costs of at least EUR 30,000 which could arise as a result of emergency medical assistance, emergency hospitalization or medical repatriation.	
	1 color photo not more than 6 months old, passport size (45 mm x 35 mm), full face and taken against a light background.	
	Applicants who submitted fingerprints in a previous application and <u>were granted a Schengen visa within the last 59 months</u> are <u>exempted</u> from resubmitting a new fingerprint.	
	For non-Ethiopian nationals: Ethiopian residence permit or proof of legal stay in any other country within the Embassy’s coverage area, valid at least three months beyond the planned stay in the territory of the Member States.	
	In case the applicant does not intend to return to Ethiopia: proof that the entry to country of origin or any other third country is guaranteed.	
	Preliminary ticket booking or travel itinerary.	
	Proof of accommodation.	
	Recent bank statement covering the minimum last three months and/or personal bank saving book.	
	Any other documents relating to the applicant's financial status and personal ties in Ethiopia, such as title deeds or lease agreements for property, vehicle registration card, marriage certificate, birth certificate of children etc.	
	If you are employed, a dated and signed letter from the current employer containing the following information: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- the applicant's personal data, function/profession- terms of employment (temporary or permanent- starting date of employment- monthly net salary- granted leave days	

	- date and contact details of the employer	
	If you are self-employed: - trade/business license - tax registration - business registration (city administration) - bank statement for business account (for the last three months, as a minimum)	
	If you are retired: - Documents proving the pension or other financial support	
	A letter from the medical institution or doctor in the Member State of destination indicating the following: - the contact with the local doctor - nature of the treatment - estimated time for recovery - the need for return visits - the cost of treatment - the mention that the patient is accepted - the indication that the treatment can be performed - the indication that the medical institution or doctor agrees with the intended method of payment	
	A letter drafted and signed within the last 3 months by the applicant's local doctor in Ethiopia providing background information about the medical treatment and confirming the need of specific medical treatment to be provided abroad.	
	Proof of pre-payment of the treatment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment (and related expenses).	
	Proof from the medical institution showing that it agrees with your intended method of payment.	
	Please note that the Embassy will consider your socioeconomic situation in your home country or in your country of residence if not the same. It is your responsibility to submit any other documents related to personal ties in Ethiopia, such as marriage certificate, title deeds or lease agreements.	

Please note:

- Applications can be submitted up to 6 months before the intended travel and **not less** than 15 calendar days before the intended travel. Please note that the days are counted from when the Embassy has received the application and **not** when the application was submitted at VFS Global. The transportation time between the application centers and Nairobi is published on the website of VFS Global.
- The handling time may take up to 15 days (counted from when the Embassy has received a complete application) but may take up to 45 days, if verification of documents or an interview needs to be conducted or such.
- All submitted documents must be in English or in Swedish.
- An interview may be required at the Embassy or by phone.
- Further information or documentary evidence in support of your application may be required.
- All documents are mandatory. If documents are not submitted at the time of application, they may be sent within **2 working days** to the following email address: ambassaden.nairobi-visum@gov.se. If mandatory documents, as stated in the checklists, are not received within the stipulated time, the Embassy will make a decision based on existing documentation.
